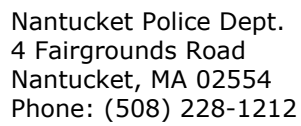

NARRATIVE

On September 6th, I, Officer Nelson, was on marked patrol in V13. At approximately 1:35 am, Officer Drumheller and I were dispatched to 82 Union Street for the report of a motor vehicle that just struck the residence at 82 Union Street. Union Street is a way in which the public has access as licensees and invitees.

Due to minimal traffic in the area, I did not activate any emergency blue lights or sirens. I was on Broad Street when the call came in and I arrived soon thereafter. In addition, Officer Santoro and Officer Fontana were in the downtown area actively looking for a vehicle with significant damage.

Upon arrival, I observed there to be significant damage to the front of the house. I updated dispatch of my observations and advised dispatch to contact the building inspector, Stephen Welch. Nantucket Fire Department was also notified. I observed the two front windows on the right side to be caved in and removed from their frame; the front door was caved in and splintered, and the two Iron railings on the front entranceway, were run over and bent into the ground. I observed there to be significant interior damage, and the building inspector later deemed the residence uninhabitable as a result from this crash.

Officer Drumheller and Massachusetts State Trooper Evans arrived on scene to assist. Officers spoke to the reporting party, Ms. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) who stated that she was asleep with her 3-year-old, Ms. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) in the upstairs left corner (directly above the crash area) when they heard a big bang and felt the house shake. Ms. [REDACTED] stated her [REDACTED] was asleep in the bedroom on the rear left corner of the residence. Officers got everyone's information and began to photograph the scene.

Ms. [REDACTED] then called the caretakers for 82 Union Street who arrived on scene to assist officers with contacting the homeowner. The caretakers were Mr. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) and Mrs. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]). Mr. [REDACTED] was able to call the homeowner, Ms. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) and update her on what was going on. Ms. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were currently in [REDACTED] and were in route to Nantucket after hearing what had occurred.

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The interior of the house also sustained significant damage. The living room couch was moved approximately a foot and there were toys and miscellaneous items thrown across the room. The side table on the right was moved approximately 2 feet off the wall and the lamp on the left side table was leaning against the left wall. The second (centermost) window was blown out the most. The frame was completely broken, and the interior frame was exposed. The doorway going into the main entranceway on the right side of the living room was also splintered. The bookcase in the entrance way was removed from the wall and books were scattered on the ground. The center stairway also sustained fresh splintering that went up the ceiling.

The interior door frame was cracked along on the perimeter of the door and there was a hole in the bottom of the door. In the dining room, there was a picture that had fell on the ground and there were some cracks going up the wall. The majority of the cracks were where two walls/ceiling meet. The third window (farthest from the point of impact) was still intact. I photographed the interior and have attached all photographs to this case.

As Officers continued to investigate the damage, at approximately 2:11 am, a passerby, Mr. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) stopped and stated that he witnessed a silver Jeep Grand Cherokee operate towards downtown with significant damage approximately half an hour prior. This would put this observation at approximately 1:40 am. Again, the call came in at 1:35 am.

Officer Drumheller put together the vehicle parts and observed the vehicle parts to be a match for a silver Jeep SUV. Jeep SUVs are known to have a signature "textured bumper cover" that was observed in the rubble. In addition, the damage to the shingles on the house indicated that the vehicle was coming from Orange Street and heading towards downtown. The shingles were moved towards the left side, indicating the point of contact was from the right. A BOLO for a damaged silver Jeep Grand Cherokee was sent out to all units.

I cleared the area, and Officer Santoro arrived to secure the scene with tape. Officers then rotated throughout the rest of the shift until it was properly boarded up the late in the morning.

While I made my way back to the station, I checked the surrounding area to attempt to locate the damaged Jeep. I drove to the Town Lot with negative findings, and I then drove down [REDACTED]tte Street towards Union Street.

At this time, I turned my head to the left and observed a Silver Jeep Grand Cherokee with significant right-side damage across the street from 45 Union Street. I advised dispatch and all units. Officer Drumheller and Officer Fontana arrived to take photographs and properly inventory the vehicle for a Nelson, Gwendolyn

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motor vehicle tow. Officer Fontana requested the motor vehicle tow which was approved by Sergeant Mauldin (474).

The silver Jeep was tucked close to a bush, and the entire right side of the Jeep was crumpled. The front right wheel well was bent back, and I observed the engine area to be exposed. The front bumper was hanging down and the front right tire was flat. The silver Jeep was bearing [REDACTED] Registration [REDACTED] and was registered to a Ms. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with an address of [REDACTED] ive, Nantucket.

Officer Drumheller and I, then went to [REDACTED] ive to attempt to locate Ms. [REDACTED] Officers were met with multiple unlocked doors. Officers announced our presence and entered [REDACTED] due to the emergence and wellbeing of the operator who may have significant injuries. Officers were met with Ms. [REDACTED]'s [REDACTED], Mr. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]). Mr. [REDACTED] showed officers a photo of [REDACTED], Ms. [REDACTED], which matched the photo on her license.

Mr. [REDACTED] also stated that Ms. [REDACTED] works at the [REDACTED], a [REDACTED] downtown. I then called [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) who I observed earlier in the night working as the [REDACTED] at this establishment. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if Ms. [REDACTED] was working tonight, to which he stated "no". I then asked if he knew a good address for Ms. [REDACTED] to which he stated "no". Mr. [REDACTED] did state he believes Ms. [REDACTED] to reside with a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) but did not have a good address for her either.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated he has Ms. [REDACTED]'s phone number, so he reached out to her. Ms. [REDACTED] called back Mr. [REDACTED] and stated that she does not know where Ms. [REDACTED] resides. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that Ms. [REDACTED] had called her when the accident had occurred in a frantic state. Ms. [REDACTED] did not speak on anything else regarding the crash but confirmed that Ms. [REDACTED] does not need any medical attention, and she will turn herself in later in the day.

Officers advised Ms. [REDACTED] that was not going to suffice, and officers needed to locate and speak to Ms. [REDACTED] as soon as possible. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she did not know where Ms. [REDACTED] was at the time.

Officers cleared [REDACTED] ive and went back to the station to continue the investigation. Ms. [REDACTED] did not come to the station until 9:45 am. Please refer to the supplemental provided by Officer Johnson that is attached to this case.

On 09/06/2025, I, was on marked patrol in V13. At approximately 6:58 pm, Ms. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Nelson, Gwendolyn

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Ms. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) were escorted into the interview room for an interview regarding the motor vehicle crash. During this interview I was trying to get a baseline for what had happened, since I was unable to obtain that on scene at the time of the crash or after (since Ms. [REDACTED] refused to speak to officers). Ms. [REDACTED] came in on her own will and agreed to provide officers with information relating to the accident.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was "literally just driving and then I was turning on that tight turn near the duck pond. There was something that jumped in front of me on my left side, wherever that side street is, just something from the left side. And I literally just turned, and I swerved my wheel to the right to miss it, and I went like over the tiny bit curb, and I hit the side of the house. I was like, I didn't really know what to do in the situation anyways, and I was already shaking. I couldn't slam on my brakes or anything, but I don't think I was going fast at all. I didn't look, I wasn't looking at my speed, but I definitely know that the turn is tight and its dark at night."

I then asked where Ms. [REDACTED] was coming from prior to crashing into the house. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she was just "driving around. Like, I, don't, I don't know. I was really; I was just driving around".

I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that I was going to need a better response than that and I rephrased my question. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she was at her friend's house and that they were planning on getting food. Ms. [REDACTED] stated "I thought about getting food, but we just went for a drive. And when I was making that turn, it, it literally happened out of nowhere. Like it was so quick, and I mean, I know I hit something, and it was like, kind of rough, but I was just shaking and I know I didn't have anything on me, and I pulled over and so like, I stopped the car there and I mean, I couldn't go anywhere else".

Ms. [REDACTED] then stated that she has never been in an accident before. She has never had any criminal history, and she was bawling her eyes out after the crash had occurred. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was aware that she actively evaded police interaction after the crash occurred and stated "I

Ms. [REDACTED] chimed in and state "there was probably an element of shock in there as well." I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that I will take everything under consideration.

I then asked Ms. [REDACTED] what friend's house she was coming from. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she was coming from Ms. [REDACTED]'s (D.O.B.: [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Avenue. I asked Ms. [REDACTED] her route of travel. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she went down Okorwaw to The Boulevarde.

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It should be noted, I stepped out to clear my throat. I returned shortly after and resumed the voluntary interview.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated she drove from [REDACTED] to the Boulevard, to Fairgrounds, to Old South Road, through the James Coffin Memorial Rotary, to Orange Street and then Union Street. I then asked where the passengers were sitting. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that Ms. [REDACTED] was in the passenger seat. I asked if Ms. [REDACTED] was okay, since officer observations indicate that passenger had their head on the passenger side window. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that there was a singular impact point with "spidering" on the window around the POI (point of impact). Ms. [REDACTED] stated Ms. [REDACTED] was not injured and did not hit her head.

To note: I have spoken to Ms. [REDACTED] over the phone, and she stated she was not injured. I requested to speak with her multiple times in person but have not received a response. Ms. [REDACTED] stated Officer Johnson saw her in person earlier and confirmed there were no injuries. Please refer to Officer Johnson's supplemental.

I then asked where the other passenger was located. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. [REDACTED] (D.O.B.: [REDACTED]) was in the back seat but was not sure of his positioning. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that he was also uninjured. I have left several voicemails for Mr. [REDACTED] but have yet to receive a response.

I then inquired about the speed again. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she "was being 100% honest. I was not looking at my speed when I was turning, but I should not have been going any more than 20 miles an hour regardless." Ms. [REDACTED] stated that everyone was wearing seatbelts.

I asked about the time frame of events. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that officers were aware of her making a phone call to Ms. [REDACTED] after the crash had occurred and I asked if she remembered what time that was at. Ms. [REDACTED] stated, "I think it was exactly right after it happened". Ms. [REDACTED] mentioned that she was just going for a night drive but not looking at the time constantly. She then stated "I'm sure it was around 1:20 am or 1:30 am.

Ms. [REDACTED] had her cellphone with her in the interview room. I asked if I could check her phone call history. Ms. [REDACTED] got her phone out and went into her phone history. At no time did I force Ms. [REDACTED] to do this. Ms. [REDACTED] showed me her recent call history and pointed to the last call was from NPD at 6:30 am. Knowing that she had other phone calls during the night from her [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED], and Ms. [REDACTED], I observed Ms. [REDACTED] deleted her recent call history. I asked Ms. [REDACTED] to click her edit button to see if that shows her recently deleted items. This function only allows you to

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delete calls from the history log, it does not reveal which calls that person deleted.

Ms. [REDACTED] interrupted and stated to Ms. [REDACTED] "I think I'm getting to the point where I think you need to have an attorney present". I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that these are routine questions that officers ask to understand the timeline of events. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that these questions are standard questions we ask after motor vehicle crashes. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that we usually ask these questions roadside, but because Ms. [REDACTED] left the scene, these questions were therefore delayed. [REDACTED] then stated to Ms. [REDACTED] that she needs to stop answering questions. I then advised Ms. [REDACTED] to leave interview room as Ms. [REDACTED] is of age to answer questions on her own accord. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] and Ms. [REDACTED] that this has been simply a voluntary interview and that Ms. [REDACTED] has been willing to speak to me about what had occurred. I advised them that they are free to go at any time. I then asked Ms. [REDACTED] to leave the interview room for a second time. Ms. [REDACTED] did so without incident.

At this time, I read Ms. [REDACTED] her Miranda Warnings. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she understood what was read to her and stated she would continue to answer questions if she has an attorney present. I asked her if she was willing to speak to me now. Ms. [REDACTED] shook her head "no".

Before terminating the interview, I wanted to make sure that Ms. [REDACTED]'s contact information was correct. I obtained information only on demographics and contact info. I did not ask her about the crash itself. I then asked her if she would be willing to go over the possible charges that will be pursued against her. Ms. [REDACTED] stated "yeah, I would like to know". I then went over the possible charges and advised her that these are just some charges that we are looking over. I went over the charge for Marijuana possession. I advised her we are pursuing this charge because Ms. [REDACTED] is

I asked again if she would like to continue with the investigation and speak on what had happened last night. Ms. [REDACTED] stated "No". I terminated the interview immediately.

After speaking to Ms. [REDACTED], I did not observe her to have any remorse for causing damage to someone's house and possibly hurting someone. From what I observed and heard, Ms. [REDACTED] was more scared about the consequences that would arise to her after this incident. Ms. [REDACTED] did not ask about the wellbeing of the occupants in the house at any time during the interview.

As mentioned above:

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After the initial point of impact, Ms. [REDACTED] continued to drive on the sidewalk, down the length of the house, ran over the two iron railings and ran over the front landscaping. Ms. [REDACTED] then returned back to the roadway and continued to drive down Union Street. This distance is about 352 yards. Ms. [REDACTED] did not leave any information on or near the house to identify herself and confirmed she was not planning on doing so at the time after the incident had occurred. Ms. [REDACTED] stated there were two other passengers in the vehicle who were not harmed during this incident. None of the occupants attempted to notify the owner of the house or emergency personnel of what had occurred.

Ms. [REDACTED] was operating on Union Street in an area that frequents pedestrians and bicyclists, especially during this time of year. At the time of the crash, the bars in the downtown area were closing, allowing for additional foot traffic in the nearby area. Ms. [REDACTED] went crossed over the white fog line, onto the sidewalk, and hit the house. On multiple occasions, Ms. [REDACTED] stated she did not know what she had hit, just that it was something large. Based off of Ms. [REDACTED]'s actions and statements, it was clear that Ms. [REDACTED] posed a significant threat to the public and could not safely operate her motor vehicle.

After the vehicle was found and identified, during the inventory process, Officer Fontana located a bag of unlocked marijuana under the driver's seat as well as marijuana paraphernalia. Ms. [REDACTED] confirmed [REDACTED] drug.

Ms. [REDACTED] confirmed she did not activate her braking system and confirmed she kept on driving. Based off of the significant damage done, I estimate Ms. [REDACTED] to have traveled at a speed of at least 40-mph in a 25-mph zone.

Ms. [REDACTED]'s could not safely operate her motor vehicle. After Ms. [REDACTED] had crashed, the Jeep's parts were hanging off of the vehicle. Ms. [REDACTED] knowingly operated her vehicle with car parts dangling off of her Jeep, which could have posed a danger to oncoming traffic/pedestrians. Ms. [REDACTED] is responsible for everything in/on or hanging off of her vehicle.

Ms. [REDACTED]'s all four tires crossed over the solid white fog line, over the "tiny curb", left the roadway and drove straight ahead into the residence at 82 Union Street. The silver Jeep completely left the roadway and failed to stay in between the solid double yellow and solid white painted lines.

Due to the above facts and circumstances, I placed an immediate threat on Ms. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] s Massachusetts license, and she was issued Massachusetts Uniform Citation [REDACTED] and # Nelson, Gwendolyn 1032

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NARRATIVE

On September 6, 2025, I, Officer Brady Fontana was on uniformed patrol in marked cruiser Victor 8. At approximately 1:35a.m., officers were dispatched to 82 Union St. for the report of a vehicle hitting the house and driving away.

A short while later, officers found the involved vehicle, [REDACTED] PAN plate [REDACTED], parked in front of 45 Union St. The operator of the vehicle had left the car. A CJIS inquiry of the vehicle showed the owner to be [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The vehicle was accessed to be completely totaled on the front passenger side. The front passenger tire was completely flat, and the entire passenger side of the vehicle had several dents and scratches from impact with the house.

I began to complete a motor vehicle tow sheet which was later attached to the case. While conducting an administrative tow inventory of the vehicle, I observed there to be a gray pouch located underneath the driver's seat. Upon unzipping the pouch, I observed there to be a green substance which through training and experience was able to identify this substance as Marijuana. I also observed there to be other paraphernalia with the marijuana inside the pouch. The pouch was entered into property for safe keeping, and the Marijuana was seized for evidence related to the initial incident.

Upon returning to the police station, I weighed the Marijuana which weighed 20.66 Grams on one scale and 20.69 Grams on the second scale. Pictures have been attached to the case.

NARRATIVE

On 09/06/2025 at approximately 1:35AM, Officer Nelson and I, Officer Drumheller were dispatched to 82 Union St. for the report of a hit-and-run MVC to the house at 82 Union St. Dispatch stated that there was no description on the involved vehicle. On arrival, Officer Nelson spoke with the individuals on scene at 82 Union St. I began to assess and take photos of the scene (See attached photos).

There was severe damage to the front of the house. The front was partially caved in and the frame of the front of the house was no longer intact. Two of the three front windows were broken and also caving into the inside of the house with the rest of the wall. The front door was cracked and caving into the house. There were metal railings to the front entrance to the house that were now completely bent all the way to the ground. Pieces from the house and parts from the involved vehicle were scattered all around the front of the house into the roadway. The pieces from the involved vehicle appeared to be from a silver and black SUV/Truck. There were pieces from a black side mirror, corner of a silver bumper, black grille, a chrome fog light, black inner lining, and black wheel well trim.

After pictures were taken of the scene of the accident, I began to gather pieces from the involved vehicle that were scattered around the front of the house and in the road. As I was gathering the pieces of the vehicle a passerby said that they saw a vehicle that was damaged and appeared to be a Silver Jeep Grand Cherokee. They said that they saw the vehicle about a half hour ago. That would have put the involved vehicle on the scene right at the time of the call. Once I gathered most of the pieces of the vehicle, I was able to piece them together like a puzzle. I had pieced together the front right corner of the silver bumper, chrome fog light, and black grille. I then matched what I had pieced together from the scene at 82 Union St to a picture of a 2024-2023 Silver Jeep Grand Cherokee which looked exactly the same. I advised over the radio to be on the lookout for a silver Jeep Grand Cherokee. I checked the surrounding area for cameras which none were found. Once the scene was secure and the building was evacuated per the town building inspector, I proceeded to search for the involved vehicle a silver Jeep Grand Cherokee. Officer Santoro stayed on scene to keep it secure.

Shortly after Officer Nelson located the involved vehicle across from 45 Union St. I assisted in taking pictures of the vehicle (see attached photos). The 2023 silver Jeep Grand Cherokee had an [REDACTED] plate [REDACTED] which came back to an [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The Jeep had significant damage to the front

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right bumper and right side of the vehicle. The right front tire was flat, passenger window was severely cracked, and the passenger side mirror was completely missing. The keys to the vehicle were sitting on the driver's seat and I could see empty containers of High Noon and Smirnoff in the trunk of the vehicle. The vehicle was soon later towed and inventoried by Officer Fontana.

Dispatch was able to locate an on-island address for the owner [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Officer Nelson, and I went to locate [REDACTED] and were unsuccessful. We spoke with [REDACTED]'s [REDACTED] [REDACTED], who hadn't heard from [REDACTED] in about a week. [REDACTED] attempted to call [REDACTED] with no luck and also tried to call some of her friends. One of [REDACTED]'s friends [REDACTED] [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] back and said she just spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] called her in a panic and said that she was fine and would turn herself into the police in the morning but did not tell [REDACTED] where she was located. At this time, we are still trying to locate [REDACTED] and are continuing to contact her regarding the incident.
